OURDEPARTED Departed this life June 15, 2020, **Benjamin Philip** Thornton, age 84, of Richmond. He is preceded in death by his wife, Arlene Thornton. He is survived by one daughter, Sharon Thornton Robinson; six sons, Benjamin M.(Ophelia), Nelson, Reginald, Terrill (Shawn), Benjamin T. (Tonya) and Kevin (Brandace) Thornton; thirteen grand-children; thirteen great-grandchildren; two sisters, Gertrude Green (Willie) and Gracie Carr; a host of nieces, nephews and cousins; and other relatives and friends.



On October 5, 2020, after a long battle with Parkinson's disease, **Alexander Slaughter** died peacefully at his home in Byrd Park in Richmond with his wife Mary at his side. He is also survived by his son, David A. Slaughter (Jodie), brother, Edward R. Slaughter Jr. (Anne), and sister, Mary Hoke Slaughter and loving nephews and nieces.

Alex grew up in Charlottesville and attended Woodberry Forest School. He received his undergraduate degree from Yale in 1960 and his law degree from the University of Virginia in 1963.

Alex served the McGuireWoods law firm in many capacities over his half-century career, including on the Executive Committee, as chair of the Litigation Department when the firm had but four departments, and as general counsel. Alex oversaw the firm's relationship with its insurance carriers for many years, and was widely regarded for his expertise in insurance coverage law.

Alex also cared deeply about his church and his community. He delivered food every night to a homeless shelter, promoted afterschool care for disadvantaged children, fought to reform the Virginia prison system, and represented death row inmates. He was a longstanding parishioner of St. James's Episcopal Church and served the Diocese of Virginia in many capacities, including as member of its Standing Committee, on the Diocesan Council, and on the Diocese Ecclesiastical Court. He served for years on the Board of Directors of the Daily Planet, which at the time operated a community clinic and homeless shelter in Richmond.

Vernon L Moseley, 81, a longtime Carillon resident, departed this life on November 3, 2020. Mr. Moseley and his wife Delores were active members of the Carillon neighborhood for many years and volunteered with Arts In the Park. He was also a former executive CCA board member and block captain. Vernon was a dedicated and devoted member of 2nd Baptist Church, Southside for over 50 years, attending regularly and serving in many capacities. He is survived by his wife Delores Moseley; two daughters Angela Moseley Scott (Phillip) and Kimberly Moseley Golder (Michael); three grandchildren Alexis Scott, and Kayla & Kendall Golder; one brother Linwood Moseley; a host of nieces, nephews and cousins; and other relatives and friends.
