Option 1 Bagged Leaves

- Up to 10 bags collected on regular trash day
- Biodegradable plastic bags preferred
- Place bags near supercan

Option 2 Unlimited Bag Collection by Sector *Residents may put out an unlimited number of bags during this period.

Carillon Section 3- Monday Trash Collection -All bags will be collected between November 25 and December 9.

Option 3- Vacuum Service | \$30 per request *May be delayed during inclement weather)

- -Nov.
- -Rake leaves to front of property line, but not into the street or gutter.
- -Leaves will be collected within 15 days from

date of request

- -Leaves must be raked and ready for pick-up when service request is made.
- -Payment methods:
 - Included on utility bill (online or 3-1-1 request only)
 - in person on 7th floor City Hall
 - mailed to the Department of Public Works 900 E. Broad St. 7th floor Richmond, VA 23219


A warm welcome to:
