VIRGINIA WAR MEMORIAL CARILLON RENOVATION/RESTORATION PROJECT

PHASE 1A



- Cleaned building exterior
- Built new ADA ramp
- Repaired and repainted plaster
- Replaced non-historic exterior lighting
- Uncovered and refurbished terrazzo floors
- Replaced existing lighting with LED lamps
- Repaired and repainted all windows
- Repointed stone masonry



PHASE 1B

 Replaced 86-year-old elevator to comply with current building code

PHASE 2

- Repair sidewalk
- Recast and restore bells



- Replace structural steel support for the bells
- Replace all roofing, including belfry and metal dome
- Repair second-floor plaza deck
- Replace restroom fixtures and finishes

- Repair exterior and interior stone masonry
- Repair limited areas of concrete structure
- Clean and replace certain areas of brick pavers
- Clean decorative interiors, limestone walls and floors, and historic ornamental plaster
- Refurbish historic lighting fixtures, including the rotunda chandelier
- Repair and recoat the interior cast iron spiral stairs

- ♦ Restore the original doors
- Repair and reinstall limestone balustrade and granite steps
- Upgrade life safety and security systems
- Replace HVAC system

I hope everyone sees the timetable for the last phase of the Carillon renovations. The work is in full swing. Many neighbors met with the State representative back in February and got a sneak peak at the renovations on the inside of the building. We were able to ask questions and establish a working relationship with the state representatives and will forward updates to you all as we receive them. Many of you have commented on the cell tower that was erected next to the Carillon along with the extension of the fence around the area. Be assured this is a temporary situation. The project is expected to be completed in 2 years. Cindy and James Lasher have worked tirelessly to make adjustments to the Arts in the Park layout for this year and next year to accommodate the changes to the area surrounding the Carillon.

Have you noticed the new trees planted in the median strip of Douglasdale Rd.? Karen Townsend, Beautification Chairperson, has done a fantastic job identifying areas that need trees and getting a team together to do the planting. The Board would like to encourage everyone to take this time before AIP to spruce up and clean up yards to let the Richmond public see the pride we all take in our neigh-

borhood. I want to remind everyone that the city does bulk pick up for yard waste and large items every other week. I also want to thank Amy Robins, Liaison to Councilperson Stephanie Lynch, for her assistance back in the fall to get critical maintenance to many areas of the neighborhood. Trees are being trimmed and dead ones removed, and potholes have been filled. Other projects will begin soon. Remember if you have a city issue on your street to use the 311 app and report it to the city.

PLEASE start flying your Arts in the Park flags the first week of April. This is a fantastic way for us to advertise AIP. so many Richmonders look for our flags as a sign of AIP approaching. We ask that you take the flags down the week after the show. A small number of flags are available this year for those on the main thoroughfares of the neighborhood and then inner streets. This will be on a first come first serve basis, following those guidelines. I look forward to seeing many of you at our Annual meeting and Arts in the Park!!! Please feel free to contact me if there is anything the Board or myself can do for you, our neighbors.
